President **Ged** pointed out that Bassetlaw Museum is an asset which we really need to use to its full potential for depositing memorabilia etc. To that end he is asking for a local Retford resident to act as Liaison Officer with the Museum. A simple duty with little responsibility other than to pop in from time to time.

Ged also requested that members should look at the photos on the website, particularly the panoramic shots from 1957, '60 and '63 with a view to adding names via the comment box. He would also like anecdotes to add to the website and there is a prize for the most complete contribution!! He did all this in the evening after the school was closed, and he also entered the old school roof area with another 'adventurous' boy.
