7. Tom Oxley: "a varied life – motorbike scrapes and campervan japes"

After lunch, Tom Oxley provided a lengthy, fascinating, and well illustrated chronology of his life and various careers to the whole group. Beginning with the 1962 "Rivals" tower ascent (many more photos and diagrams of this are in the website "1962" gallery) Tom used over 30 of his own photos and videos to illustrate his travels around Europe and the world.

Tom's life appears to have begun with a childhood chimney collapse and thereafter travels been heavily punctuated by motor cycle accidents, and numerous other near death experiences.

Exploits have extended well into his recent years and growing family, and amongst them the crossing of the Humber Bridge on his hover board, exploring underground tunnels, and sledging off the top of enormous Northumberland sand dunes.

Tom's talk was rewarded with warm applause from the appreciative group.
